

## **Homework Policy**

At Undurba State School we believe that homework should provide students with:

- opportunities to consolidate their classroom learning
- pattern behaviour for lifelong learning beyond the classroom
- an opportunity to involve family members, where appropriate, in their learning.

The setting of homework should take into account the need for students to have a balanced lifestyle. This includes sufficient time for family, recreation and cultural pursuits.

At Undurba State School we believe that homework should enhance students' learning by:

- Being purposeful and relevant to students needs
- Being appropriate to the phase of learning (early, middle)
- Being appropriate for the capability of the student
- Developing student's independence as a learner
- Being varied and challenging
- Allowing for student commitment to recreational, family and cultural activities

The latest research about homework indicates that we need to take into account, when setting homework, all the extra curricular activities children participate in. We need to also develop organisational skills by allowing them to learn how to budget their time to complete homework tasks in their already busy lives. Participating in regular household activities enables both boys and girls to develop their verbal communication and collaborative skills. i.e. talking and working together This enables children to recognise their own responsibilities at home and be credited for them as this is part of development and learning and should be on par with academic learning and achievement. It is also widely recognised that daily reading and the practising of sight words from a young age are paramount for childrens' literary development. At Undurba State School our homework policy reflects these beliefs.

The following homework is expected for each year level:

Prep – no homework

Years 1-2 Home reading, sight words and spelling words (Monday to Thursday)

Years 3-6 Homework grid

It is envisaged that students will complete homework within the following time periods:

Prep – no homework

Years 1 -3 no more than 15 minutes per night

Years 4-5 no more than 20 minutes per night

Years 6 no more than 30 minutes per night

If a child's homework is consistently taking longer than the recommended time, parents / caregivers need to discuss this with the classroom teacher.
